### **Purpose:**

The HOPE network was created to connect local teachers in the area of Health, Outdoor Education and Physical Education. The idea is to enable regional teachers to have access to high quality Professional Development in a local setting, as we regularly have to travel long distances to receive similar professional development. This conference is the culmination of resource sharing and networking amongst local teachers, to ensure their professional needs are met in a supportive, local context.

#### Format:
